

What is Futures for Frontliners?

- A State of Michigan scholarship
- For essential infrastructure
 workers without a high school
 diploma or post-secondary degree
- Provides tuition-free access to Michigan's public community colleges to earn an associate degree or industry-recognized certificate





Pathways to Community College



- ► Path 1: Frontliners who have a high school diploma (or equivalent)
- ▶ Path 2: Frontliners who need to complete a high school diploma (or equivalent)
 - Coordination through an Adult Education provider

Roughly 625,000 Michiganders could qualify for this program



Am I Eligible?

- Be a Michigan resident and eligible for federal aid
- Have worked in an essential industry at least half-time for 11 of the 13 weeks between April 1 – June 30, 2020
- Have been required by their job to work outside the home at least some of the time between April 1 – June 30, 2020
- Not have previously earned an associate or bachelor's degree
- Not be in default on a Federal student loan
- Complete a Futures scholarship application by 11:59 pm on December 31, 2020



Website and Application(s)

- Applicants can apply now at Michigan.gov/Frontliners
 - will need access to the internet, an email address and a social security number to apply

- Deadline to apply is Dec. 31
 - Must begin classes in 2021

Path 1: Community college for Frontline workers who have a high school diploma (or equivalent)

Path 1: Steps to Apply and Receive the Award

- First, complete the <u>Futures for Frontliners scholarship application</u> under "Community College"
 - Employment Verification Form
 - Check your application status on the MiSSG Student Portal
- Once your scholarship application has been accepted:
 - Apply to and be admitted to a Michigan community college
 - Apply for federal aid by submitting a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
 - Enroll in classes at least half-time in 2021



Path 1: Scholarship Funding

- Futures funding for community college is last-dollar.
 - 1. Pell grant and tuition-restricted scholarships or awards (excluding TIP)
 - 2. Futures for Frontliners

 Non-tuition restricted gift aid or awards (other than the Pell Grant) are not to be subtracted from the calculation of the award.



Path 2: Community college for

Frontline workers who need to complete a high school diploma (or equivalent)

Path 2: Applying for the Scholarship

- Applicants must complete the Futures for Frontliners-High School Completion application on the website.
- The applicant must provide:
 - Name and contact information
 - Date of birth
 - Social security number
- The Employment Verification Form will be requested to be completed if we cannot verify work experience as frontline worker through data match with wage records.



Path 2: Receiving the Award

- Upon acceptance, applicants must:
 - Enroll in a state-approved adult education program (i.e., state or federally-funded program)
 - Begin adult education classes in 2021
- Students can be dually-enrolled in adult education and a community college or job training program or complete the programs sequentially.



Path 2: Scholarship Funding

- ► The funding covers:
 - High school completion and equivalency preparation
 - Career advising and navigation
 - High school equivalency testing fees (as applicable)
 - Last-dollar scholarship for community college or job training program



Path 2: Community College and Job Training Requirements

- Must enroll in a community college or training program that leads to an industry-recognized credential or an associate degree, including:
 - A training or associate degree program at any accredited Michigan public community college
 - A training opportunity available on Michigan Training Connect (MiTC)
 - A state-approved adult education integrated education and training (IET) program that leads to an industry-recognized credential
