Get Out the Vote Toolkit

This year, we have important elections on August 6th and November 5th. Nonprofit organizations like yours have a proven ability to empower our communities to vote, with data showing that people engaged by nonprofit organizations were 10% more likely to vote! That's why we are so grateful to you for joining United Way for Southeastern Michigan in encouraging voters to turn out on election day.

General Election Important DatesTo line up your social media posts and messaging with important election deadlines, keep these key dates in mind.

- Now: Voters can print and submit a paper application for an absentee ballot.
- Now: The Secretary of State's online application for an absentee ballot is open.
- Sept. 17: National voter registration day
- Week of Oct. 13: Sign up for an absentee ballot
- Week of Oct. 20: Vote early in-person or drop off your absentee ballot
- Oct. 21: Last day to register to vote online or through the mail.
- **Oct. 22:** Recommended last day to drop your ballot in the mail (for most voters). After this date, we recommend dropping your ballot at your local city or township clerk's office.
- Oct. 26 through Nov. 3: In-person early voting.
- **4 p.m. on Nov. 4:** Deadline to vote in person with an absentee ballot at your city or township clerk's office.
- Nov. 5: Election Day! Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Voters who need to register or update their registration address, can do so at their city or township clerk's office until 8 p.m. Your completed absentee ballot, whether submitted by mail or by hand-delivering the ballot to your clerk's office or their drop box, must be received by your city or township clerk by 8 p.m. on this day.

Dear ___,

In 2020 and 2022, we saw record voter turnouts. People young and old showed up to the ballots - some for the first time – to make their voices heard and shape their communities. Now in 2024, we want to carry that momentum forward and elect people who will represent our needs as Michiganders.

RIGHT NOW and until October 21, you can sign up to get an absentee ballot through the Secretary of State's website. After filling out your ballot at home, either mail it in or deliver it to your clerk's office or the office's drop box by 8 pm on election day.

November 5 isn't the only day to vote, just the last. If mail-in doesn't work for you, Michigan has 9 DAYS of early voting, from October 26-November 3!

If you have any questions about voting or need support with pretty much anything, you can call 2-1-1, open 24/7 to serve you! You can also find links to important websites and more information about voting in Michigan HERE.

Follow these steps, and we'll see you at the polls!
